Before joining WBS, Bhékinkosi Moyo was Chief Executive Officer of the Southern Africa Trust, and prior to that spent seven years with TrustAfrica as Director of Programmes, contributing significantly to the body of knowledge on African philanthropy and public policy.

Currently a member of the Alliance magazine editorial advisory board, Mr. Moyo was Research Fellow and subsequently Director of Programmes at TrustAfrica, where he spent almost seven years focusing on African philanthropy, civil society, and democratic governance.

GRAÇA MACHEL

Founder
Graça Machel Trust

Graça Machel is an African stateswoman whose decades long professional and public life is rooted in Mozambique's struggle for self-rule and international advocacy for women and children's rights. She is a former freedom fighter in Mozambique's FRELIMO movement and that country's first Minister of Education.

In the years following her tenure in government, Machel produced a ground-breaking UNICEF report "The Impact of Armed Conflict on Children" that changed the way the United Nations and member states respond in conflict zones. Since then, she has worked tirelessly in support of global health, child welfare, and women's rights and empowerment.

Machel works through several regional and international development bodies to accelerate social transformation. Machel is a founding member and Deputy Chair of The Elders, and played a key role in establishing Girls Not Brides. She is a member of the UN Secretary-General's Sustainable Development Goals Advocacy Group and sits on the High-Level Steering Group for Every Woman Every Child.

Machel lends her expertise to a number of organizations in a governance role. She serves as Board Chair of the Africa Child Policy Forum, Board Chair of the African Centre for the Constructive Resolution of Disputes, Board Chair of United People Global as well as Executive Chair of the Mandela Institute for Development Studies. Machel is a Board Member of the Mo Ibrahim Foundation and Education Above All. She is Board Chair Emeritus for the Partnership for Maternal, Newborn & Child Health (PMNCH) and is a UNICEF Young People's Agenda Global Advisory Board Member. She is Chairperson of Nelson Mandela Children's Hospital Trust and a Trustee of the Nelson Mandela Children's Fund. She also sits on the Jack MaNetpreneur Advisory Board.

Additionally, she is the Chancellor of the University of Cape Town, Chancellor of the



African Leadership University and the President of SOAS.

Machel has created three non-governmental organizations in her own right. She founded and serves as President of the Foundation for Community Development and the Zizile Institute for Child Development. She founded the Graça Machel Trust in 2010 where she focuses on advocating for women's economic and financial empowerment, food security and nutrition, education for all, as well as good governance.

Among numerous awards, Machel has received the United Nations' Nansen Refugee Award in recognition of her long-standing humanitarian work. In 1997, she was made an honorary Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire. She is a member of the Ambassador David M. Walters International Paediatric Hall of Fame. In 2018, she was awarded the World Health Organization's highest honour, the WHO Gold Medal, for her enormous contributions to the health and wellbeing of women, children and adolescents. She was also acknowledged by Women Deliver with their 2019 Lifetime Achievement Award.

Graça Machel has dedicated her life to improving the fate of women and children, inspiring hope, and building a more just and equitable world for us all.

As United States Peace Corps Country Director, she led the post-conflict re-establishment of the Nepal programme (2014-2012) and grew Peace Corps Tanzania to be one of the agency's largest health and education programmes on the African continent (2011-2009). Working in a regional capacity as Peace Corps Sahel Programme Advisor (2008-2006), she guided effective volunteer programming in seven countries.

From 1986 to 2005, Ms. Wojnar served in progressively responsible humanitarian and development positions within the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) as Sahel Region Director covering 7 countries (Dakar, 2006-2003), East Africa Deputy Director covering 14 countries (Nairobi, 2003-1999), and DR Congo Programme Coordinator (Kinshasa, 1998), in addition to working at the headquarters of the IFRC (Geneva, 1998-1993) and the American Red Cross (Washington D.C., 1992-1989). She began her career as a volunteer working to eradicate Guinea Worm in the Republic of Benin (1989-1986).

Ms. Wojnar holds Masters of Arts Degrees in Management (McGill University, Montreal) and African Social Change & Development/Economics (Johns Hopkins School for Advanced International Studies, Washington D.C.), a Diploma in International Management, (INSEAD, France) and a Bachelor's degree with Honors in Letters (Wesleyan University, USA).

Professor Coleen Vogel is a climatologist by training and has undertaken research in climate change, climate vulnerability and adaptation, with a particular focus on disaster risk reduction and climate variability.

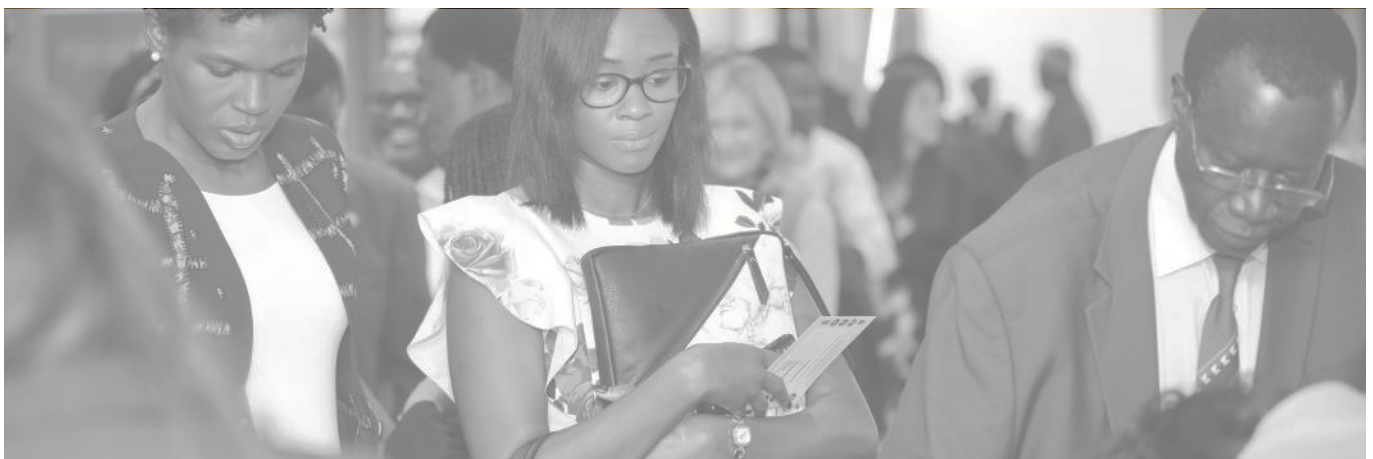
She was one of the key contributors to the writing of the Green and White Papers on South African Disaster Management and was a major contributing author for the Disaster Management Act.

She was one of the Chapter Lead Authors of the Africa Chapter for the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, IPCC 4th Assessment Report and was also an author of the Synthesis Report for Policy Makers of the 4th IPCC Assessment Report. This large team of various scientists, together with Al Gore, received a Nobel Peace Prize. Coleen was a Chapter Author on Human Security for the 5th IPCC assessment report.

Coleen has also been involved in various international global environmental change activities. She has been Chair and Vice Chair of international committees (for example, the International Human Dimensions Programme, now known together with other international programmes as Future Earth). She has received an international award, the Burtoni Award, for her work on climate change advocacy and science of climate change adaptation.

Her current research interests include transformative education for global environment change and sustainability, climate change in its broader context and adaptation and disaster risk reduction focusing particularly on the interactions between physical and social dimensions shaping change. She is very keen to build links and collaborations with others, particularly in sustainability and transdisciplinarity science.

Coleen is currently project lead on the City of Johannesburg Adaptation and climate change. Passionate about youth development she is very involved in mentoring students (both undergraduate and post graduate) helping to advance both theory and praxis in various practical research projects with value-add impacts. In addition to being an adaptation specialist, Coleen is also undertaking research into transdisciplinary research approaches in various African contexts.

ZELIA MENETE

Fundação para o Desenvolvimento da Comunidade

Zelia Menete is a holder of a PhD in soils, crops and atmospheric sciences (Cornell University, Ithaca NY, USA), MSc in Soil & Water Management (Wageningen Agricultural University, the Netherlands) and a BS Honors in Agronomy (Eduardo Mondlane University, Mozambique).

Ms Menete has more than 30 year experience in teaching, research, consultancy and development, having occupied positions as research scientist, Vice-Chancellor, CEO and Director of various institutions. Currently she is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) at the Foundation for Community Development (FDC) and a Professor at UEM since 2005.

From 2007 to 2014, she served as board member of the Foundation for Community Development (chaired by Graça Machel), and currently a Board member at the Manhica Health Research Center (CISM and Fundacao Manhica), Board Chair at the Centre of Learning for Civil Society (CESC) and Forum for Children Rights (ROSC).

She was an international research scientist (IRS) at the International Potato Center (CIP), member of the Consultative Group of International Agriculture Research (CGIAR). She was the chief of party and leader of the USAID/OFDA funded project to disseminate and bring sweet potatoes technology to scale in Mozambique, covering 5 provinces, 52 districts and targeting 150 thousand households (800 thousand direct beneficiaries) with new technologies of orange-fleshed sweet potatoes (OFSP), 2013-2011.

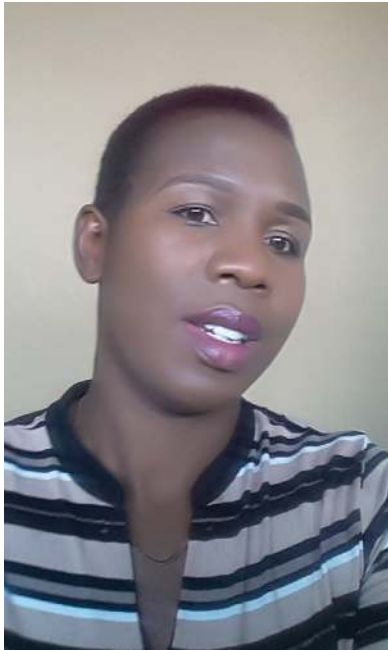
She was a team member of the External Programme and Management Review of the CGIAR center - the Africa Rice Center (WARDA) and visited and evaluated Africa Rice centers including work at the National Agriculture Research Centers (NAR's) in Senegal, Uganda, Benin, Mali, Burkina Faso, Mauritania and Mozambique. Research and teaching interest were on agronomy and natural resources management (soils, nutrients and water), plant nutrition, use of geographic information systems, remote sensing, spatial statistics and environmental impact assessment among others for planning, monitoring and inventory land cover changes. Ms Menete was a Vice Chancellor of Manica Polytechnic (2009-2005) and Environment Councilor at Municipality of Matola (2002-1998).

Conducted various consultancies for the World Bank, Government of Mozambique (central, Provincial and districts), bilateral such as Ireland development aid, Swiss development Cooperation, UN family, Helvetas, Netherlands embassy in Mozambique, FAO among others, as well as other multilateral donors in areas such as reform of technical vocational qualification and training, planning, evaluation of rural development projects, training of Governmental officials, NGOs, CBOs and private sector on environmental management in Mozambique, South Africa, Kenya and Tanzania for the Secretariat of Coastal Area Management (SECAM) for Southern and Eastern Africa (2000-1997), among others.
